

China Visa Information

Conference attendees who are not Chinese citizens need a Chinese visa to enter China.

Attendees can apply for a tourist visa or a business visa at the Chinese embassy or consulate in the region where they live. For most attendees, it is easiest to apply for a Tourist ("L") visa; an invitation letter is not required for obtaining a Tourist visa. If some participants need another type of visa that does require an invitation letter, the NetCod 2011 local organization will be glad to help. (Scanned files of your passport (the cover and first page) should be sent to the conference mailbox: netcod@leaderstudio.net).

Tip:

To avoid uncertainty, participants will be advised to apply for a visa as early as possible. It is recommended that they apply for a Chinese visa at least 1 month in advance.
